
What is Elsa?

I'm an Editor, what should I expect next?


1. Look out for a project invite email from: *Elsa* <elsa@notification.elsevier.com> Don't see the invite in your inbox? Check your spam/junk folder and make sure you add elsa@notification.elsevier.com to your safe sender list.
2. Click on the 'Get Started' button in your Elsa invitation. You'll be taken to Elsa to create your Elsa account.

After I invite Contributors, what should they expect?

1. Contributors will receive an email invitation to Elsa from: *Elsa* <elsa@notification.elsevier.com> If they don't receive their invite, they should check their spam/junk folder and make sure they add elsa@notification.elsevier.com to their safe sender list.
2. They will click on the 'Get Started' button in their Elsa invitation email. Then, they'll be taken to Elsa to create their Elsa account.

3. Before Contributors can start using Elsa, they will accept their Contributor Agreement and a copy of their Contributor Agreement will be emailed to them.
4. Contributors will then access their chapters and start writing.
