


Elsa Quick Guide for Contributors

Elsa's Publishing Assistant informs you about missing items and tagging to improve your content's discoverability.






Elsa makes communication and monitoring your progress simple. Track your project through easy-to-follow workflow stages and version comparisons.




Getting Started: Logging into Elsa and Starting Your Chapter

feedback




Final Editor Review (4/10 Stages)


Editor reviews the revised chapter, sending it back for more edits if needed


